Possibility to include Third Party Documentation in the
ECO Frequency Information Database (EFIS)

ECO Circular Letter

Dear CEPT/ECC MoU/LoU partners,

The ECO has recently added new sections in the EFIS database (www.efis.dk). This includes the European Common Allocations Database (ECA) now merged into EFIS, and also a new section called "spectrum inventory" where for the first time in EFIS non-regulatory information about the real, actual spectrum usage in Europe can be provided. An informative presentation about EFIS and the recent changes is attached to this letter.

A new document type "Third Party" documents is also planned to be added in this section to support the possibility to include third party documentation (in the form of a document or link) which is considered of interest in regard to the actual or planned use of spectrum. Third party documents will be uploaded by the ECO in agreement with the party which owns the document.

Users of the EFIS database can then select/search for information after frequency and/or radio application, document type, and in this manner easily retrieve the information in EFIS related to the actual use of a piece of spectrum in which they are interested.
