We would not seek to mandate a barcode or QR code. If administrations wish to include one for their own purposes, then this should not be disallowed.

Details:

The delivery of licences is a matter for individual administrations. While acknowledging Annex 1 of T/R 61-01, the format of an amateur radio licence, too, is a matter for individual administrations.

Electronic documents should be available for radio amateurs as an option. While they might be promoted, they should not be the sole option. Any changes to licensing systems take time and cost money. In the absence of a very persuasive business case (and noting that we believe that our licensing system delivers what we need), it would be hard to justify the changes that would be needed to our licensing system or the investment in them.
